## TRACK FACTS

- Two spurs off the main line (operated by Wisconsin and Southern Railroad), each over 1,200 ft long with a ramp at the end
- A loading area on each side of the spurs allows the terminal to be utilized for various types of commodities needing to be shipped in the region

## BENEFIT TO BUSINESSES

- Access to Wisconsin and Southern Railroad - enabling businesses to have access to every single North American Class 1 Railroad and ports
- Ability to ship via rail if business is not located on a rail spur
- Access to rail network with little to no capital investment
- Alleviates and minimizes impacts of issues with long haul trucking costs and truck availability for shippers
- Takes long haul trucks off the road, resulting in a longer lasting highway infrastructure system and safer travel for the general public
- Creates diversity in service and pricing of shipping options for customers served by a railroad
- Allows shippers using the water system (Great Lakes and rivers) to ship year-round; while waterways shut down in winter, rail continues to operate
